The FDACS received grant support from the [National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research](#).

We used data from the 1990 [U.S. Census Bureau](#) to compare characteristics of persons in the four counties of interest to those who participated in the FDACS. This had to be arranged with the Bureau directly, because we needed ZIP-code specific information. Consequently, we purchased data from the Bureau which they generated specifically for this project. The Bureau was willing to do this because we were a contractor for NIDCR at the time.

We used data from the 1989 U.S. National Health Interview Survey from the [National Center for Health Statistics](#) to compare dental care use nationally with dental care use of persons in the FDACS. These data are available to the public by purchasing them on a CD-ROM. However, to analyze them adequately, one needs SUDAAN statistical software to account for the complex sampling design.
